The disciples witness this ascension in this weekend's first reading with Christ being lifted up and disappearing into a cloud. They're left dumbfounded until the words of two mysterious 'men



in white' break them out of their staring silence. But it is Jesus' final words to them that are most important, telling them to stop wondering and asking questions as they will soon receive the Holy Spirit, enabling them to carry on his work here on Earth. This is their mission or vocation and Jesus obviously feels they are ready to take it on (or soon will be, with the help of the Holy Spirit). St Paul encourages us in the second reading to find our vocation, saying we've all 'been given our own share of grace, given as Christ allotted it'. While our 'share of grace' may not involve casting out devils, speaking in tongues and wrestling poisonous snakes as in today's Gospel, we can think of some applications of these gifts in our everyday lives. Can we take the time to be of assistance to someone who is struggling physically, mentally or emotionally? Can we communicate more clearly or kindly? And there are surely times when we can choose to avoid poisonous thoughts or words from ourselves or others.

The good news is that we're not alone in our struggles with our vocation. The Gospel tells us that Jesus ascended – not into a cloud – but to his rightful place, at God's right hand. As Jesus lived a human life, he understands our human imperfections and challenges and intercedes for us as we seek to fulfil our own vocations. *Jennifer Cahill*



"Christ the mediator between God and the human race, judge of the world and Lord of all, has passed beyond our sight, not to abandon us but to be our hope. Christ is the beginning, the head of the Church; where he has gone, we hope to follow." (Preface)

"May you, who believe Christ is seated with the Father in his majesty, know with joy the fulfilment of his promise to stay with you until the end of time." (Solemn Blessing)

The Ascension is Jesus' final commissioning of the disciples to go out into the whole world and proclaim the Good News.
