Have Faith, He is with You

Today's Gospel tells the well-known story of Jesus calming the elements and saving his disciples from drowning at sea. To the sceptic, this story is of course nonsense and probably didn't happen. To the believer, taking this story at face value, it speaks of the omnipotent power of the Almighty God.

In reading this Gospel, I think it is useful to think about why the Gospels were recorded. While some relay historical facts, many were written to give us an insight into who Jesus was and a lesson in how to go about our lives as followers of Jesus, that is, to live as a Christian.

Have you ever known a person, or perhaps you are one of those people, who is good in a crisis? These competent people, know what to do, what to say and have the ability to empower people to pull together and manage a disaster. Some do this professionally, think firefighters, life savers, ambos, critical care nurses, emergency physicians. While others, blessed with an abundance of common sense and emotional intelligence, emerge from the group as and when needed to sort things out. I think today's Gospel demonstrates this quality in Jesus. His disciples were in panicked fear of their boat sinking and taking them with it. They looked to Jesus, their leader, to help them, to quell their fear and help them sail through the storm. Jesus rose to the occasion and they sailed safely through. He did of course chide them for their lack of faith: "Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?"

Considered in this way this Gospel is not a fantastical tale of something unlikely to have happened. It tells of a very real and highly probably event; boats get caught in storms all the time. Metaphorically, it tells us, that with faith in the power of our God we can overcome our fears and achieve much. *Gina Clare, Pastoral Associate*

Blessing for Gina Clare, Ashgrove Pastoral Associate; This weekend 22-23 June at





THE NATIVITY OF ST JOHN THE BAPTIST 24 JUNE: The joyful importance of John's



birthday can be linked to the meaning of his name in Hebrew. "Yeho-Hanan," means "The Lord is gracious" and as Luke's account underlines, in sending John the Baptist, God had shown great favour, not just to the childless couple, Zechariah & Elizabeth, but to the whole of humanity. Before the Baptist came on the scene, the prophetic voice in Israel has been silent for 400 years. When John came into the desert near the river Jordan, he breathed fire and preached repentance and renewal. All four Gospels agree that it was he who prepared the way for Jesus the

Christ, the Anointed One of God. So the whole Christian traditions honours John the Baptist as the precursor, the one who ran ahead as herald of the graciousness from God which came through Jesus, filled with grace and truth.

FEAST OF ST PETER AND PAUL 29 JUNE: Saints Peter and Paul are considered



the foundational pillars of the Church. Peter represents the stability of the Church and the office of the Vicar of Christ. Paul represents the mission of evangelization that was entrusted to the Church by Jesus Himself. He was also the Church's first theologian, which is seen in his numerous letters that expound on the Gospels. Though unlikely, one tradition states that they were both martyred on June 29, in Rome, making them twin martyrs. Their twin martyrdom reminds us that the Church must be both

stable and mission-oriented. It must remain grounded in the ancient Truth, yet grow and flower with an ongoing understanding of the mysteries of faith. As we honour these two pillars of the Church, recall the fact that, though they are great saints, they were also ordinary men called to extraordinary vocations. They responded and God used them in ways they could have never imagined. Ponder your own calling in light of theirs and resolve to lay your life down for the Church, joining yourself to these two men so that God can continue their holy mission through you.

ORDINATION ANNIVERSARIES: On and around the feast of Saints Peter and Paul are the ordination anniversaries of many Brisbane priests. Thank you for keeping them in your prayers in their ministry of leadership and shepherding the flocks entrusted to them. **Prayer After Communion:** Grant us, O Lord, who have been renewed by his Sacrament, so to live in the church, that, persevering in the breaking of the Bread and in teaching of the Apostles, we may be one heart and one soul, made steadfast in your love.


INVITATION TO A HEALING MASS: Are you in need of healing prayer for you or your family? An invitation is extended



DOING THE WORK OF LITURGY Part 1

The Second Vatican Council said that the "full conscious and active participation by all the people" in the liturgy was of utmost importance. Readers, musicians and others with up-front roles are obviously actively involved in the liturgy, but what about other people? Here are six things which everyone can do to participate more fully:





- Take part in the action of the liturgy by listening attentively, joining in the responses, sharing the sign of peace and by taking notice of the symbols, sounds and smells of the celebration.
- Pray our parts of the Mass as though every prayer depended upon our words. The story goes that in the early Church in Rome the assembly's response in the Great Amen sounded like the rumble of thunder! How does ours sound?
- Join in the hymns and sung responses. Singing is one way in which everyone can participate in the celebration of faith.
- Continue the celebration of Mass after we leave the church and extend our ministry as disciples of Christ into the rest of our lives. The words of the familiar hymn express it well: "Go now you are sent forth to live what you proclaim, to show the world you follow Christ in fact, not just in name".

Teachers and parents hosted a variety of amazing workshops across the day from archaeology to robotics, digital photo editing, ballet and vegetable preservation (just to name a few!). Every student from Prep to Year 6 selected several workshops to participate in throughout the day and then in a culminating activity, all students heard an inspirational story about how passion with purpose can change the world for the better. It was indeed a wonderful day and an event we will be adding to our annual calendar.





Athletics

This week St. Joseph's students participated in their annual athletics carnival.

Held over 2 days students participated in field and modified field events along with track events.

On Tuesday, at Marist College, races and modified field events were held under beautiful blue skies.
Students ran 100m and 200m events and a selection of students also ran 800m. Between these events, all students also had an opportunity to participate in a variety of modified field events games such as turbo javelin, softball shotput and relays.

On Wednesday, students who had qualified during their weekly HPE lessons, took part in high jump, long jump and shot put competitions. For all students our sporting carnivals are an opportunity to experience the emotions of competition and to practice their persistence, resilience and teamwork. Place getters from our carnival events will have opportunity to represent the school at Zone and District competitions next term.



Year 2 students have been learning about the connections our Indigenous culture has to the land. Students spent the day exploring the grounds of Mt Cootha Botanic Gardens to investigate how specific plants are/were used by Aboriginal communities for foods, tools and medicines. It was a great way for our Year 2 students to connect with nature and explore the culture of our First Nations people.

Last Wednesday our Year 4 students were lucky enough to participate in the "Museum Meet Up" program targeted at school students at the Queensland Museum.

Students spent the day learning about science as a human endeavour by exploring a day in the life of a palaeontologist. They had the opportunity to ask questions about real-world science and explore the museum's exhibitions and collections. It was a unique and informative experience for our students, providing a great way for them to extend their learning beyond the classroom setting.
