In today's passage from Mark's gospel, Jesus sends out his twelve apostles to preach, to heal and drive out demons. He commissions them to share the good news of salvation with a world in need.

Evangelisation is not just about spreading a message; it's about sharing a person. It's about introducing others to Jesus Christ, who is the way, the truth and the life. The apostles were sent out with a clear mandate: to proclaim the kingdom of God. They were not sent merely to teach doctrine or morality, but to bring people to an encounter with Jesus who is the source of all hope, joy and peace.

The apostles were sent out with little more than a walking stick and a few words of instructions. They had no fancy degrees, no wealth and no prestige. But they had faith – in Jesus, in his message and in the power of God. And that faith was enough. It was enough to drive out demons, to heal the sick, and to bring people to repentance. It is enough to change the world.

May we be inspired by the example of the apostles, who went out with courage and faith, and may we too be filled with the spirit of Jesus as we strive to share the good news with a world in need. *Fr Tomi*

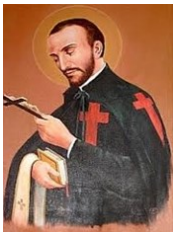
SR ELAINE WAINWRIGHT We have received the sad news of the death of Sr Elaine Wainwright RSM on 5 July, 2024. Many of you would have fond memories of Elaine who was a lecturer at the Holy Spirit Seminary from 1982 to 2001. In 2003 Elaine moved to Auckland where she was the Head of Theology and Professor of Theology at the University of Auckland until 2014 when she retired. Aside from her teaching and lecturing, Elaine's impressive resume included many publications of books, journals and articles on varied subjects within the context of church life. Many also learned much from her occasional lectures and workshops over the years. She will be sadly missed. A Funeral Mass was held on Friday 12 July at Holy Trinity Catholic Church followed by a burial at Nudgee cemetery. We extend to Sr Elaine's family, her religious community, friends and her students, our deepest sympathy and prayers at this time.

FEAST OF CAMILLUS DE LELLIS: Camillus is the founder of the Camillian Order and is co-patron (with John of God) of hospitals, nurses, and the sick. Born at Buccionanico in the Abruzzi region of Italy, at age seventeen he fought with the Venetian army against the Turks. A very large man, he contracted an incurable disease of the leg, around 1574 lost all of his money through gambling. This all led to his religious conversion. He tried to join the Franciscans, but was denied profession because of his health. He returned to the hospital where he had helped people before and consecrated his life to the care of the sick and the reform of health care. He founded the Order of the Ministers of the Infirm (Camillians) in 1582 to continue his work. He died in Rome on 14 July 1614 and is the patron of the sick and those who serve them.



The Camillian priests, Fr Jojo, Fr Ignasius & Fr Rodel who all reside at Canali house continue the dedication & work of St Camillus in their hospital chaplaincy ministry at the RBWH, Mater, St Vincents, Prince Charles and St Andrew's hospitals.

PROPERTY UPDATE: Centacare management have notified the Parish that they will not be renewing their lease at 187 Kennedy Tce, Paddington. A review of the Parish property assets confirms that the facility is surplus to Parish needs and, is not required by other Archdiocesan agencies. As a result, the Parish have made the decision to sell the property so that funds can be redistributed for alternate mission purposes. A five week marketing campaign for the sale of the property will be commencing on the 16th of July. The property will then be put to sale via a public auction on Thursday the 22nd of August. Further updates on the sale will be provided after the auction has taken place.

LIFT UP YOUR VOICE: Music is an important part of special gatherings – singing “Happy Birthday to you”, carols at Christmas, etc – and singing is integral to liturgy because it too is a celebration – a celebration of faith.



The hymns that we sing enable us to express our faith in a way that otherwise we might find difficult to do and words often take on a much deeper meaning when sung. Singing also offers a unique means for us to express joy and enthusiasm. Singing is a way that everyone can fully participate in the liturgy as we are expected to do. We sing because we are people of prayer and, according to an ancient proverb, those who sing pray twice.

This personal story about people singing at Mass has an important message for us all.

“A few months ago I was feeling devastated after the death of my husband. I would go to Mass but found myself unable to join in singing the hymns or responses. But my spirits were lifted by the singing of those around me. It felt as if my fellow parishioners were singing for me when I couldn’t. When my voice was silenced by grief, the community of the faithful carried me. Over time, they gave me back my voice and I was able to sing with them again.”

God knows whose spirits you might lift and who you might help regain their lost voice by joining in the hymns, refrains and responses at Mass!

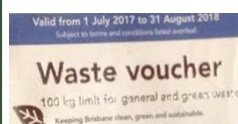

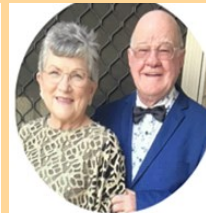
