**Getting back into gear.** The festive season has been great. Now we are settling into the rhythm of Ordinary time. This is the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time. Lent starts 18 February. Easter will be the beginning of April.

In today's gospel the Baptizer sees Jesus coming towards him and points him out as "the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world." For his listeners this was a shift of gears. They knew the power of the Passover lamb (Ex 12: 1-13) and the messianic Suffering Servant (Is 53:7). Both were experiences of God stepping in to save His people.

Every time we gather for the Eucharist, we recognise the One John pointed to. Jesus comes to us as the centre of our worship, the Lamb of God who has taken away the sin of the world. The gospel refers to "sin", to the collective brokenness of the world, the social and structural evil that Jesus is to confront.

In the Prologue of John's Gospel, we hear that the Baptizer's mission was always to point people to Jesus. The Baptizer's last words in John's Gospel sum up his calling, "He must increase, and I must decrease." That's the rhythm of discipleship. God who is to increase traction in our lives. We then help others notice Christ "coming toward" them.

In the First Reading from Isaiah the Servant of God accepts the call to be a light to the nations. The Servant is to shine hope into places of darkness, exile and discouragement. Paul, writing to the Corinthians, reminds them that all in the community are called to be saints. Each person is a unique manifestation of God.

The Isaian Servant, Paul and the Baptizer all say "yes" to God's invitation. We make the psalm our own, "Here I am Lord; I come to do your will." As God comes toward us, we respond with an open ear, a generous heart, and an engaged presence. After celebrating Christ's birth at Christmas, we now let His peace and hope take flesh in us brightening our homes, work and neighbourhoods as the new year gets underway.

**Response:** Here I am, Lord; I come to do your will.

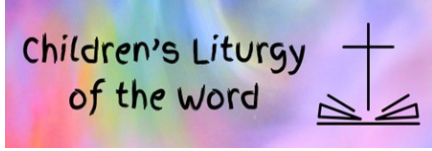

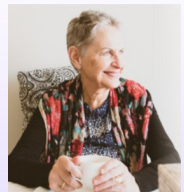
