Finding the path — The Gospel today starts with two disciples walking away from Jerusalem after Christ's crucifixion and resurrection (or disappearance, as they then thought). They are devastated by the loss of Jesus and disappointed that he didn't set Israel free in the way they were expecting. They are in such a fog of despair and confusion that they don't recognise Jesus when he walks beside them.

They continue to not recognise him as he quotes scriptures prophesising and interpreting the many events they had witnessed. It seems incredible that they are so distressed and distracted that they don't recognise the man who has been living among them, who they've followed around the country. But then again, they saw him die and death is the end, or so they thought.

When they reach their destination, the disciples come out of their fog for long enough to extend an act of kindness to the stranger, offering him a meal and a place to rest for the night. Yet is it not until Jesus blesses the meal and breaks the bread that the disciples recognise him. As soon as they see him, he vanishes, though his presence and words continue to burn in their hearts and they return to Jerusalem. We're all on our own roads to Emmaus, distracted, confused and sometimes sad or heading in the wrong direction. But just as the disciples recognise Jesus after listening to the scriptures and sharing a meal at the table, we can be with him at every Mass when we come out of our fog to listen to the Word of God and share Eucharist. And even though we may not see him with our eyes, he is present in our hearts, patiently waiting to help guide us on our path. ***Jennifer Cahill***

POPE LEO XIV has called on world leaders and individuals to empty their hearts and minds of hatred and violence, and to start serving life. “Enough of the idolatry of self and money! Enough of the display of power! Enough of war! True strength is shown in serving life,” he said during a special evening prayer vigil for peace in St Peter’s Basilica on Saturday. “Prayer can move mountains, the Pope said in Italian. “War divides; hope unites. Arrogance tramples upon others; love lifts up. Idolatry blinds us; the living God enlightens.” “Let us believe once again in love, moderation and good politics,” he said, urging people to learn more and “get personally involved” in being part of “the mosaic of peace!”



POPE IN CAMEROON Pope Leo’s message so far during his April 13-23 visit to Africa has been one of peace and reconciliation. In his speech, Pope Leo said he came to Cameroon “as a shepherd and as a servant of dialogue, fraternity and peace...to encourage each of you to keep moving forward with enthusiasm and perseverance in building the common good.”

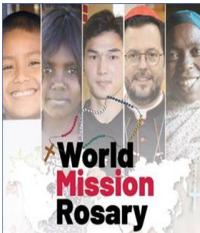

NEW LEGISLATION TO PROTECT CHILDREN: Child safety has been strengthened recently by two new pieces of legislation – the Queensland Child Safe Standards and Queensland Reportable Conduct Scheme. These frameworks and commitments align closely with the existing National Catholic Safeguarding Standards. To familiarise parish staff and volunteers with the new legislation, all will be required to complete a brief (15 minute), one-off mandatory compliance training module on the ArcheLearn online training system. Additionally, the Office for Safeguarding Services will be offering webinars on the Reportable Conduct Scheme, including some practical scenarios of how our obligations can be met. Further guidance, tools and support to assist parishes and ministries to implement the Child Safe Standards and prepare for commencement of the Reportable Conduct Scheme (from 1 July 2026) will be provided in coming months. If you are asked to complete this training over the next few weeks, please do so promptly to ensure you understand the obligations under the new scheme.

The Archdiocese and its agencies reaffirm a united commitment to standing with victim-survivors calling out injustice, and working together as a community of faith to prevent domestic and family violence.
